### **DON'T MISS THE DEADLINE: 2026 LICENSE RENEWAL GUIDE**

It's almost time to renew your license. The Board will begin accepting renewal applications on October 1, 2025. In addition to the renewal application, licensees holding a limited or unlimited license must submit a credit report, and licensees holding a roofers license must submit a bond continuance.

The final requirement for renewal is the completion of six hours of continuing education. The designated qualifying representative (DQR) must complete continuing education for corporate entities. Visit our website for a list of approved courses. Two of the six hours must meet the Alabama specific requirement. Alabama specific courses will contain the following: \*\*\*This course meets the Alabama specific requirement\*\*\*

The completion of continuing education must be reported by the provider within five days of completion. Do not send completion certificates to the Board. Licensees desiring an inactive license are not required to submit the additional documentation or complete continuing education. However, continuing education is required to return to active status.

Licensees who will be 60 by October 1st are exempt. However, the exemption must be claimed by submitting an age exemption form. This is a permanent exemption and only needs to be claimed once.

Licensees renewing for the very first time are also exempt. No action is needed for this exemption.

The Board will accept renewal applications even if the continuing education isn't complete.

However, no license will be issued until all requirements, including continuing education, are met. During the online renewal process, the Board will provide your continuing education status. If you disagree with the status, continue with the renewal process, and send an email to ce@hblb.alabama.gov.

- November 30 Deadline to not Incur late fee
- December 31 Licenses expire

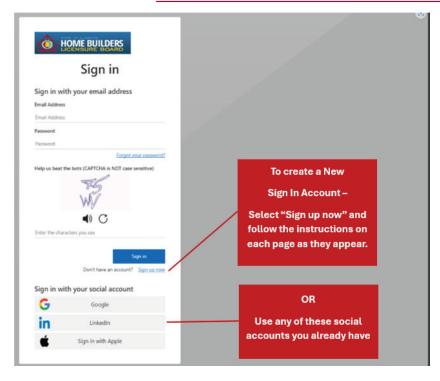
- Age 60+ by Oct 1 File age exemption form (permanent)

# ON OCTOBER 1, 2025, THE HBLB UNVEILS A NEW FULL SERVICE ONLINE PORTAL

### NO MORE SECURITY QUESTIONS! HOORAY!

Some residential additions require new keys to access. Perhaps the most exciting update—no more dreaded security questions! If you've ever struggled with "Forgot Password?" you'll be glad to know this is a thing of the past. Here's what's new:

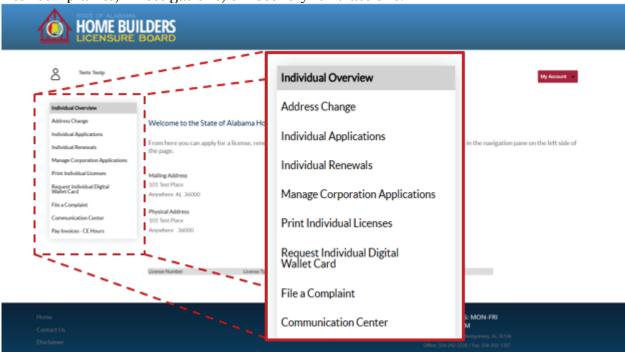
- **The bad news:** Due to a system upgrade, ALL existing users will need to create a new login by selecting "Sign Up Now" on the login page.
- **The good news**: You can now link your HBLB account to your Google, LinkedIn, or Apple account—making access quicker and easier without juggling yet another password.

#### LIFE AFTER LOGIN

As before, all login accounts are attached to an individual's record. Once logged in, users will see a modernized dashboard with expanded access:

- View and manage your individual record.
- Access corporate records if you're a Designated Qualifying Representative (DQR) or CE Contact.
- Attorneys representing homeowners can now create their own logins to manage cases related to complaints, investigations, or recovery fund actions.



### **ONE STOP SERVICE, ANYTIME**

The new portal provides 24/7/365 service to all users with tools designed for convenience:

- Update contact information.
- Print a license or request a digital wallet card.
- Submit questions or respond to documentation requests.

### Everything you need, all in one place!

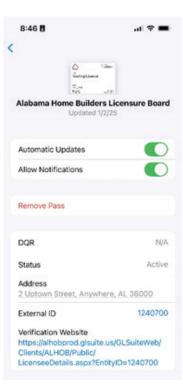


### A NEW ERA: DIGITAL WALLET CARDS WITH QR VERIFICATION

As Bob Dylan says, "Times they are a changin". The Board no longer mails wallet cards and certificates. Instead, a link is emailed to licensees so they can save and/or print the wallet card and certificate. The wallet card and certificate can only be printed once. Therefore, the Board recommends saving them and printing later.

The digital wallet card contains all the information that appears on the paper card along with a QR code. The QR code can be scanned so homeowners and building officials can verify the licensure status of the presenter. This feature is especially helpful if the license has been suspended or revoked. It is also beneficial after renewal ends on December 31st. All renewal applications are considered timely submitted if submitted prior to the Board's established deadline, which is December 31st. Until the Board approves, denies or rejects the timely submitted renewal application, the existing license remains active. Homeowners and building officials





can scan the QR code and see whether the licensee has timely renewed. This feature is not available with the paper wallet card. The Board encourages homeowners and building officials to take advantage of the digital wallet card.

### DON'T BLEND IN—NEW RULES HELP SEPARATE LICENSED BUILDERS FROM UNLICENSED CONTRACTORS

Whether on television, radio, social media, truck signs, newspaper ads (print and digital) or yard signs in front of houses a home builder has performed work, all of these efforts are ways licensed home builders market themselves every day to consumers. But guess who else "markets" them-selves every day to consumers. Unlicensed home builders! And with all the advertising and no way to distinguish who is licensed or not, consumers, the reputation of the profession and each in-dividual licensed home builder are harmed.

That's why in 2024 the legislature made changes to the law and the Home Builders Licensure Board implemented new rules related to advertising. The goal is to give licensed home builders a way to hold themselves out and readily distinguishable

from those who are unlicensed. The change is simple. In your methods of advertising, display or share your valid home builders license number. You have worked hard to earn and maintain your license. Display it! That unlicensed builder cannot. The more licensed home builders make consumers aware you are licensed, the un-licensed builders no longer are able to blend in and get lost in the marketing and advertising.

In fact, the definition of a residential home builder now even contemplates advertising. That means, when we discover that unlicensed builder advertising themselves, the Board now has the legal authority, working with the Attorney General to get that person stopped.

"Every opportunity, every chance, every time when advertising, a licensed home builder should proudly tell consumers here is my HBLB license number," said Chip Carden, Executive Director of the Alabama Home Builders Licensure Board. "The Board made these rule changes to protect consumers, help licensees to separate themselves from unlicensed contractors and help Board investigators and staff more easily identify unlicensed contractors who are taking advantage of and harming consumers," Carden added.

The law and rules now define advertising as it relates to home building and requires licensed

> home builders to display the valid license number in advertising. Additionally, as a part of the contract execution, you should make sure your valid license number is made a part of the contract. This can be accomplished by simply writing in next to the signature line for the homebuilder. To read relevant law and

So what is next? The Board will continue to communicate to all licensees to make sure you are displaying your valid home builder license in advertising. The Board will begin to reach out to media to make them aware of the advertising requirements. We will expand our outreach and communication with local jurisdictions to remind them of the advertising requirements. And finally we will begin to taking legal action against unlicensed home builder advertising.
